References to the Act are to the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Act [Chapter 22:23] and references to the regulations are to the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets (General) Regulations, 2018 (Statutory Instrument No. 5 of 2018). The terms and requirements in the Act and Regulations govern the submission of Proposals and should be read by all Consultants.

Preparation of Proposals:

Only consultants registered with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe in terms of section 4 of the Regulations are eligible to participate.

You are requested to submit a Proposal to provide the consulting services detailed in the Statement of Requirements by submitting separate technical and financial proposals, as detailed below. The standard forms contained within this Request for Proposals may be retyped for completion but the Consultant is responsible for their accurate reproduction.

You are advised to read carefully the complete Request for Proposals document, including the Special Conditions of Contract in Part 3, as well as the Contract Agreement and the General Conditions of Contract for Consultancy Services (available on the Authority's website or on request), before preparing your proposal. Part 3: Contract Agreement is provided not for completion at this stage but to enable Consultants to note the Contract terms they will enter into if their bid is successful.

Number of bids allowed

No Consultant or Firm may submit more than one bid, either individually or as a joint venture partner in another bid, except as a subcontractor. A conflict of interest will be deemed to arise if bids are received from more than one Consultancy owned, directly or indirectly, by the same person.

Bidders are also required to submit the following mandatory documents for eligibility;

- 1. Proof of registration with the Procurement regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe;
- 2. A copy of current and valid tax clearance certificate and VAT registration;

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- 3. Company Profile;
- 4. Certificate of Incorporation, CR6 and CR14 or other company registration documents;
- 5. Detailed Curriculum Vitae with supporting documents
- 6. Proof of registration with the Council of Estate Administrators as an Insolvency
 Practitioner or A registered Corporate Rescue practitioner or a registered liquidator
 under the Insolvency Act Chapter 6.07
- 7. Should be a member of the Insolvency and Restructuring Association of Zimbabwe (IRAZ)
- 8. Bidders MUST state the number of operational experience;
- 9. **Declaration of any Litigation.** This should be on your company letter head or from your attorney. Bidders should give, if there is any, details of the litigation which they may have been involved in and any, which they are involved in.

Preparation of Technical Proposals:

Technical proposals should contain the following documents and information:

Basis of Pricing and Payment:

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The contract will be a time based contract.

Payments will be made on the following basis:

The contract price must be a maximum amount. Payment will be made for the time actually spent and for reimbursable expenses actually incurred by the Consultant in the performance of the Services, using the rates specified in the Breakdown of Contract Price.

Validity of Proposals:

The minimum period for which the Consultant's proposal must remain valid is sixty (60) days from the deadline for submission of proposals.

Sealing and marking of Proposals:

The technical and financial proposals should be sealed in separate envelopes, both clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number above, the Consultant's name, the name

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of the Procuring Entity and either "Technical Proposal" or "Financial Proposal" as appropriate.

Both envelopes should be enclosed in a single outer envelope, clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number above, the Consultant's name and the name of the Procuring Entity. All the two envelopes should be sealed in such a manner that opening and resealing cannot be achieved undetected. The single outer envelope make a single full bid. Bids should be submitted in triplicate with one (1) original copy marked "ORIGINAL" and two (2) copies each marked "COPY" All 3 copies should be in sealed envelopes clearly marked with the details of the tender, and should be deposited in a tender box situated at the below address. Means of acceptance:

Bids in the sealed envelopes shall be deposited in a tender box situated at the above address. All the bidders should record their bids in the tender submission register situated thereto, in the format prescribed in the register.

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Opening of Proposals:

The technical proposals will be opened in public immediately following the deadline for submission. Financial proposals will be kept unopened and the evaluation committee will have no access to financial information until the technical evaluation is concluded.

Financial proposals of rejected bids will be returned unopened. Financial proposals for accepted bids will be opened in public on the date specified in the notice of results for the technical evaluation.

Withdrawal, amendment or modification of Proposals:

A Consultant may withdraw, substitute, or modify its Proposals after it has been submitted by sending a written notice, duly signed by an authorized representative. However, no Proposal may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of Proposals and the expiration of the period of proposal validity specified by the Consultant or any extension thereof.

Evaluation of Proposals:

The evaluation of proposals will use the Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) evaluation methodology as detailed below:

Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS):

- Preliminary examination to confirm that all documents required have been provided, to confirm the eligibility of consultants and to confirm that the Consultant has accepted all terms and conditions without material deviation or reservation;
- 2. Technical evaluation to assess the technical quality of proposals against the criteria below, to determine the technical score for each proposal and to determine which proposals reach the minimum technical score given below; and
- 3. Financial evaluation to determine the financial score of each proposal, to weight the technical and financial scores and to determine the total score of each proposal. Proposals failing any stage will be eliminated and not considered in subsequent stages.

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Technical Evaluation Criteria:

Submitted proposals shall be evaluated and awarded by using the technically qualified with lowest price approach. Technical proposal shall be evaluated out of 80% whereas Financial shall be evaluated out of 20%.

Below is the breakdown of the scores on technical proposal out of 100% which shall be deduced to 80%:

The minimum technical qualifying score required to pass the technical evaluation is 80 points.

Financial Criteria:

Financial scores will be determined by awarding 100 points to the lowest priced proposal and giving all other proposals a score which is proportionate to this.

Total scores will be determined using a weighting of 80% for technical proposals and a weighting of 20% for financial proposals."

Currency:

Bids should be priced in both United States Dollars (US\$) and Zimbabwean Dollars (ZW\$). The payment will be made in Zimbabwean Dollars, using the prevailing exchange rates published by the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe (RBZ). The US\$ price shall be used as the bases for any future price increases in the event of RBZ rate movement.

Recommendation for Award:

The proposal with the highest total score will be recommended for award of contract, subject to any negotiations required.

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Award of contract:

Award of contract will be by placement of a contract in accordance with Part 3 of this Request for Proposals. The proposed award of contract will be by issue of a Notification of Contract Award in terms of section 55 of the Act which will be effective until signature of the contract documents in accordance with Part 3: Contract. Unsuccessful Consultants will receive the Notification of Contract Award and, if they consider they have suffered prejudice from the process, they may, within 14 days of receiving this Notification, submit to the Procuring Entity a Challenge in terms of section 73 of the Act, subject to payment of the applicable fee set out in section 44 of and the Third Schedule to the Regulations.

The contract will only be valid subject to payment of annual contract administration fees in line with Part V of the Fifth Schedule to the Regulations.

Right to Reject:

The Procuring Entity reserves the right to accept or reject any proposal or to cancel the procurement process and reject all proposals at any time prior to contract award.

Corrupt Practices:

The Government of Zimbabwe requires that Procuring Entities, as well as Consultants, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of contracts. In pursuit of this policy:

- 1. the Procuring Entity will reject a recommendation for award if it determines that the Consultant recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive or obstructive practices in competing for the Contract or been declared ineligible to be awarded a procurement contract under section 99 of the Act; a definition of these terms is found in clause 1.9 of the GCC;
- 2. the Authority may under Section 72 (6) of the Act impose the debarment sanctions under section 74(1) of the Regulations;
- 3. in accordance with section 42 of the Regulations, submission of a bid will be deemed to be an undertaking on behalf of the Consultant to accept the responsibilities described in clause 1.1 of the GCC; and
- 4. Any conflict of interest on the part of the Consultant must be declared.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

PROCUREMENT ON AN INSOLVENCY AND LIQUIDATION TRAINER TO TRAIN ZIMBABWE REVENUE AUTHORITY (ZIMRA) STAFF.

BACKGROUND

The Zimbabwe Revenue Authority is mandated by the Revenue Authority Act (Chapter 23:11) to assess, collect and enforce payment of all revenues due to the State. Debt Management is one of the enforcement strategies that Zimra uses to effectively and efficiently collect revenue. Some of the debtors may be in financial distress resulting in liquidation or may be placed under Corporate Rescue depending on the recommendation of the creditors and the courts. In June 2018, the new Insolvency Act, Chapter 6:07 was gazetted and it replaced Insolvency Act Chapter 6:04 and some provisions of the Companies Act (Chapter 24:03). The purpose of the new Insolvency Act is to provide for the administration of insolvency and assigned estates and the consolidation of insolvency legislation. Critically, the Insolvency Act replaced judicial management as a business rescue strategy with corporate rescue proceedings. These changes necessitates capacity building of ZIMRA Staff so that they are up to date with the provisions of this new Act. This will ensure correct procedures are employed to safeguard revenue at stake in cases of insolvency or corporate rescue. Internally, ZIMRA does not have the expertise in this regard and will therefore need to outsource such training from qualified practitioners.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE OF THE CONSULTANCY

To capacitate ZIMRA employees in understanding the provisions of the New Insolvency
Act, Chapter 6:07 so that they effectively and efficiently discharge their duties when
dealing with insolvent clients, those under liquidation or Corporate rescue.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, participants should be able to

- Adhere to notice of each court proceeding, decision, meeting or other relevant event;
- Participate in every court proceeding arising from Corporate Rescue/Liquidator

- Vote to amend, approve or reject a CR plan and, if the plan is rejected, to propose
 the development of an alternative plan or present an offer to acquire the interests of
 any or all of the other creditors in terms of Section 145
